

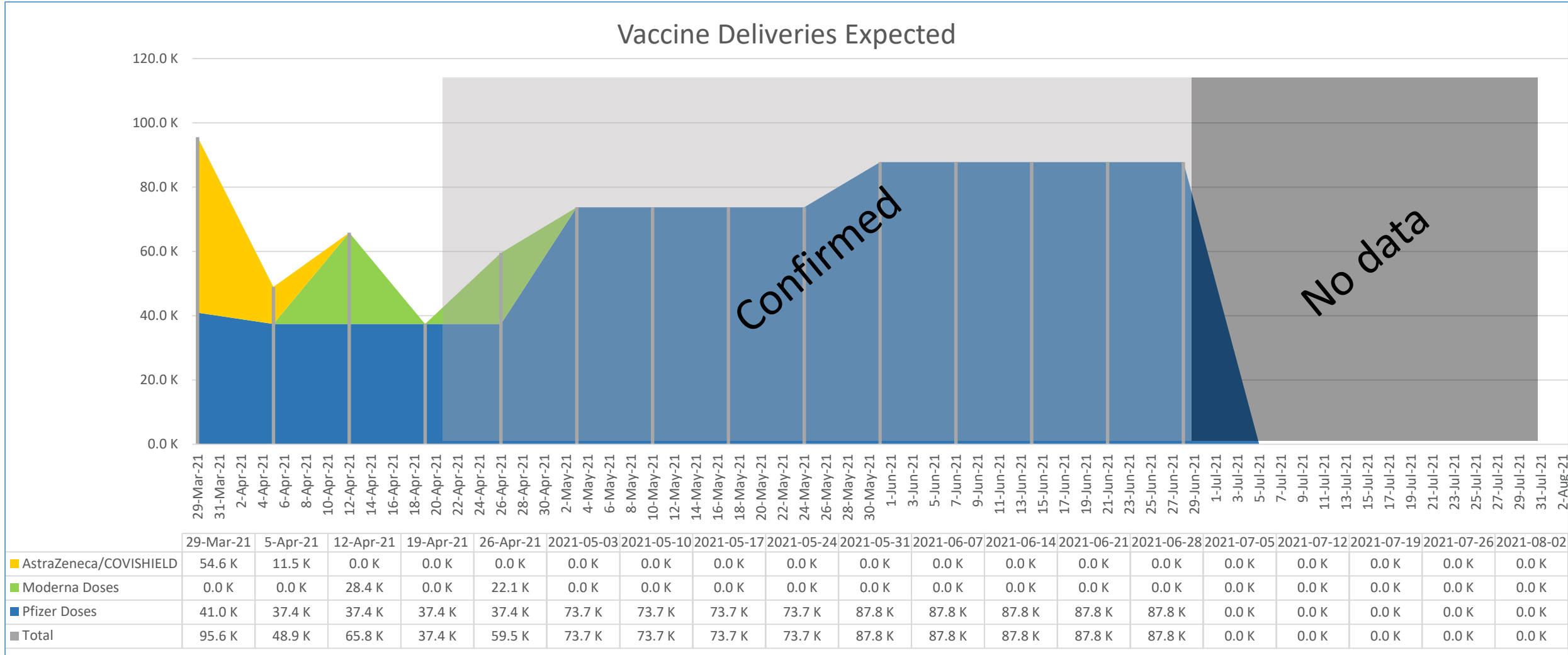

# COVID-19 DOSE DELIVERY SCHEDULE

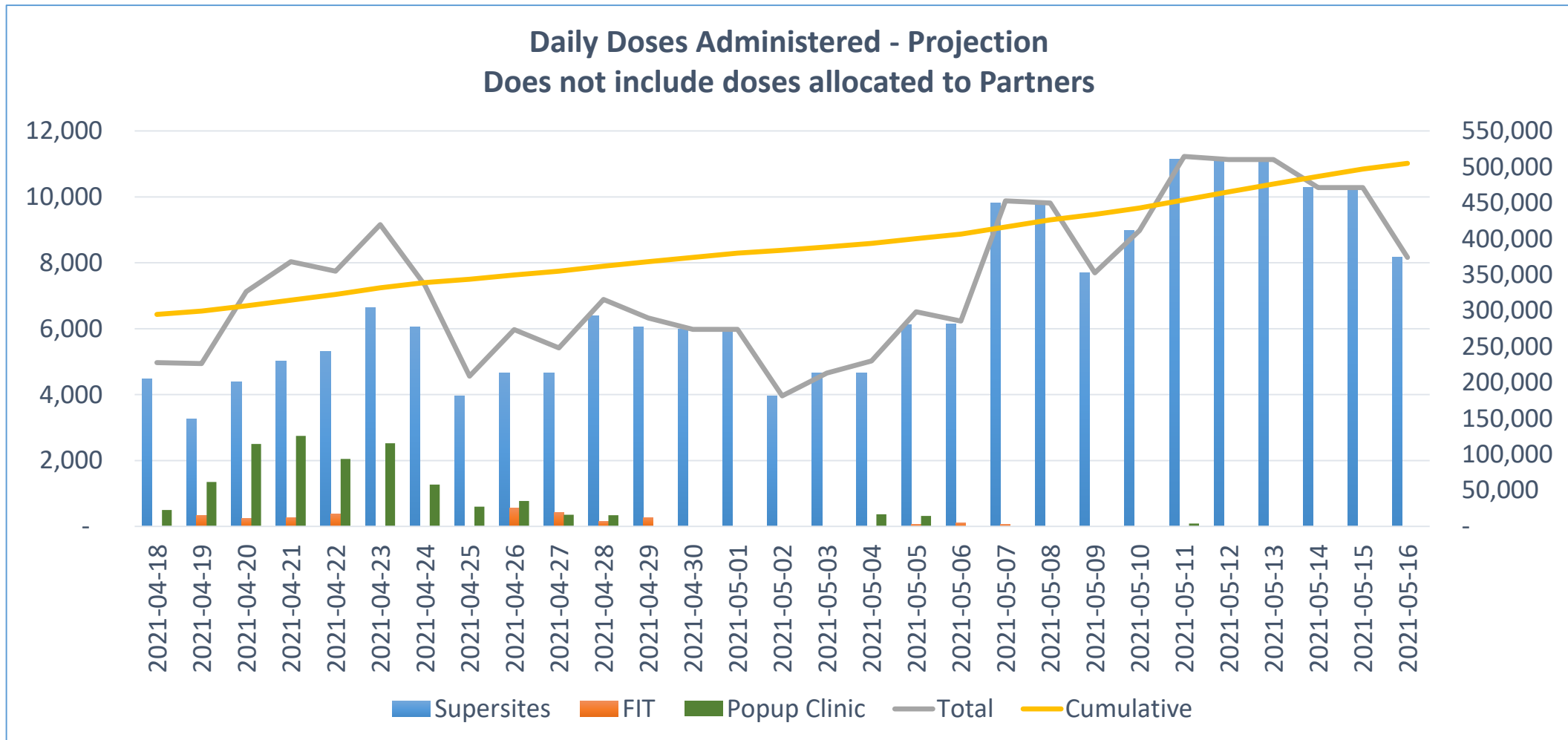


As of April 19, 2021.

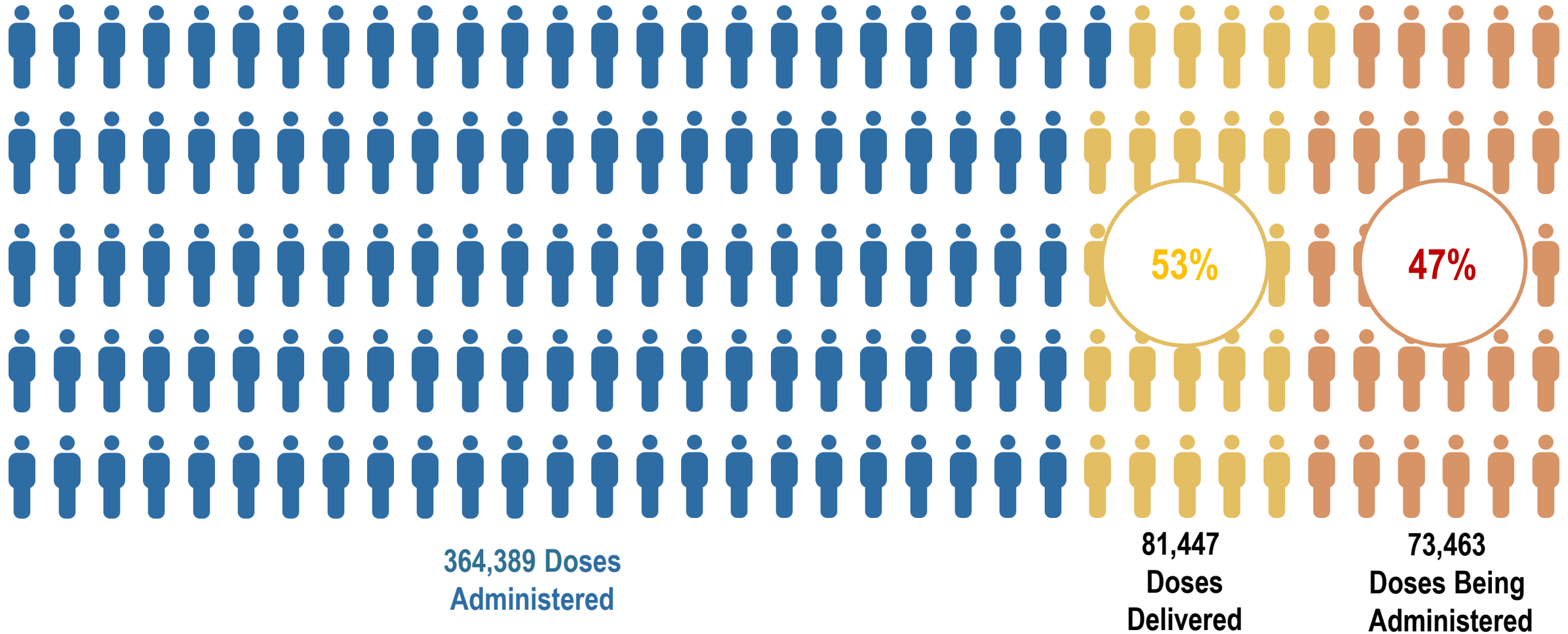
Moderna shipment for the week of Apr 19 is delayed. Expected arrive in the following week, reduced to 22,100 doses.

Pfizer shipments increase to 73,710 doses each week from the week of May 3, and further ramp up to 87,750 doses each week from the week of May 31 to June 28

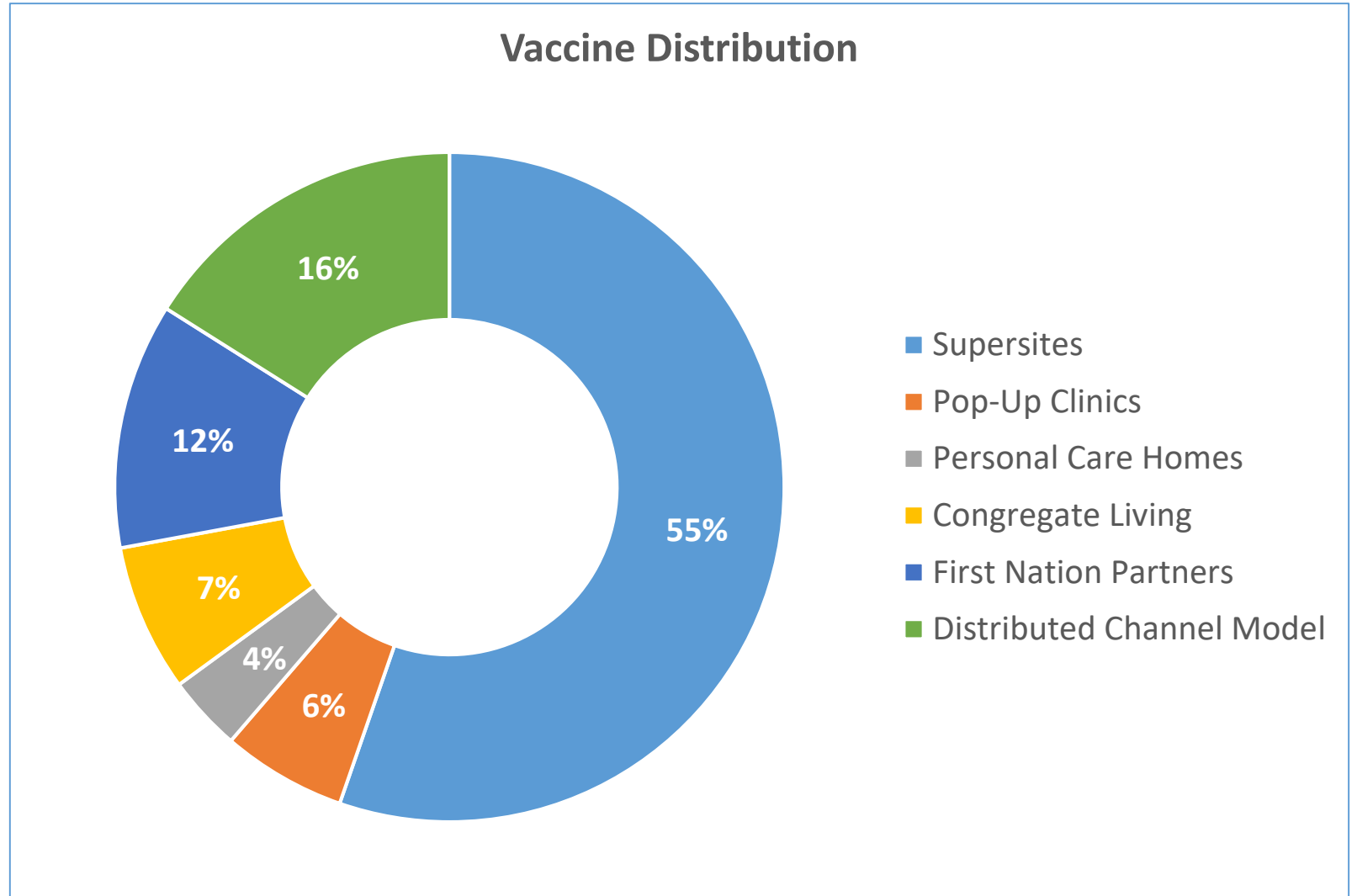

# IMMUNIZATION FORECAST SCENARIO

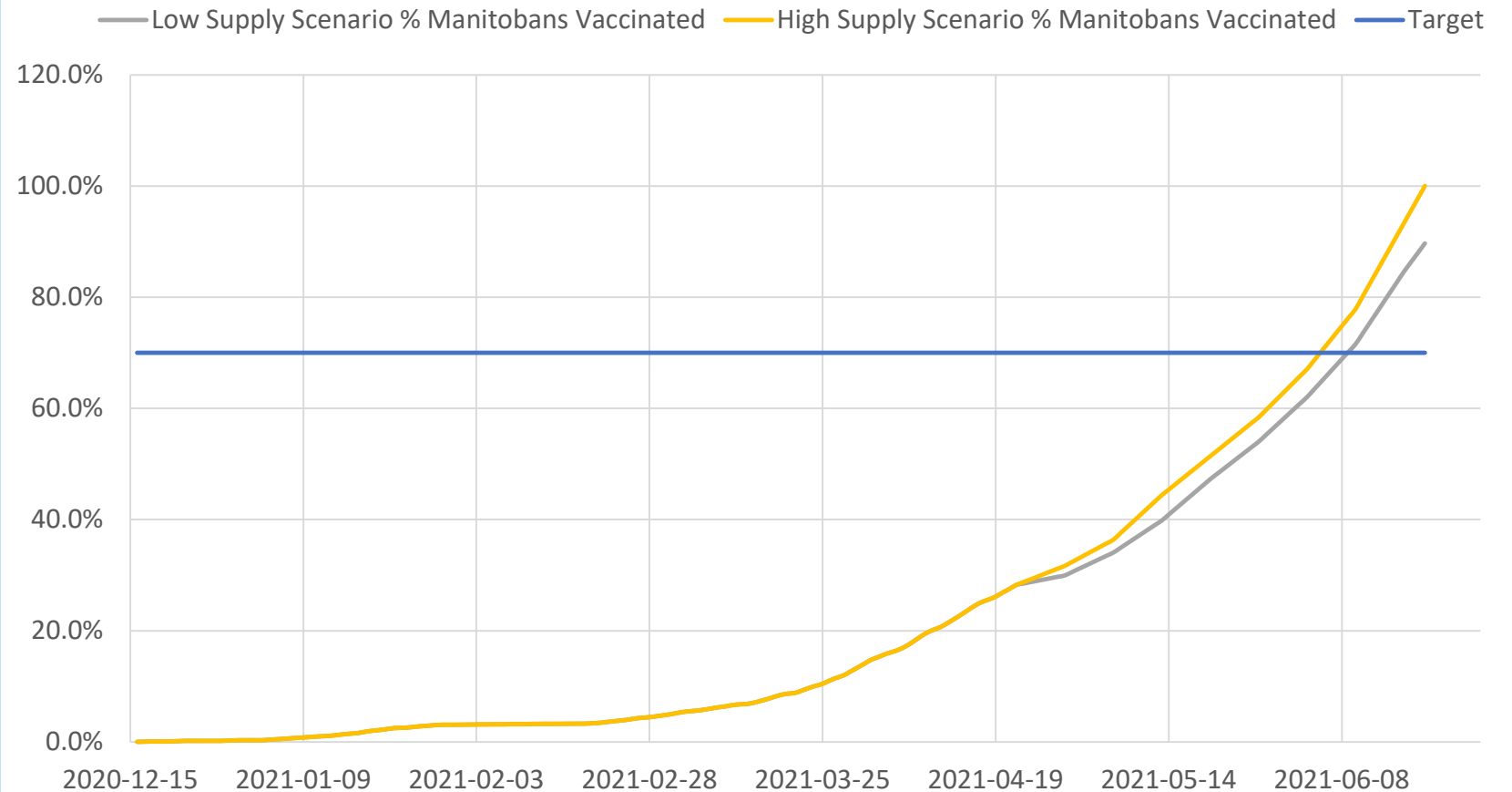


Low Supply Scenario: Based on Pfizer, Moderna and AstraZeneca/Covishield vaccines.

High Supply Scenario: Based on Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca/Covishield, Janssen, and Novavax.

Target: 70% uptake rate (18+)  
Low supply scenario: **June 9**  
High supply scenario: **June 5**

## Expanded to 40+

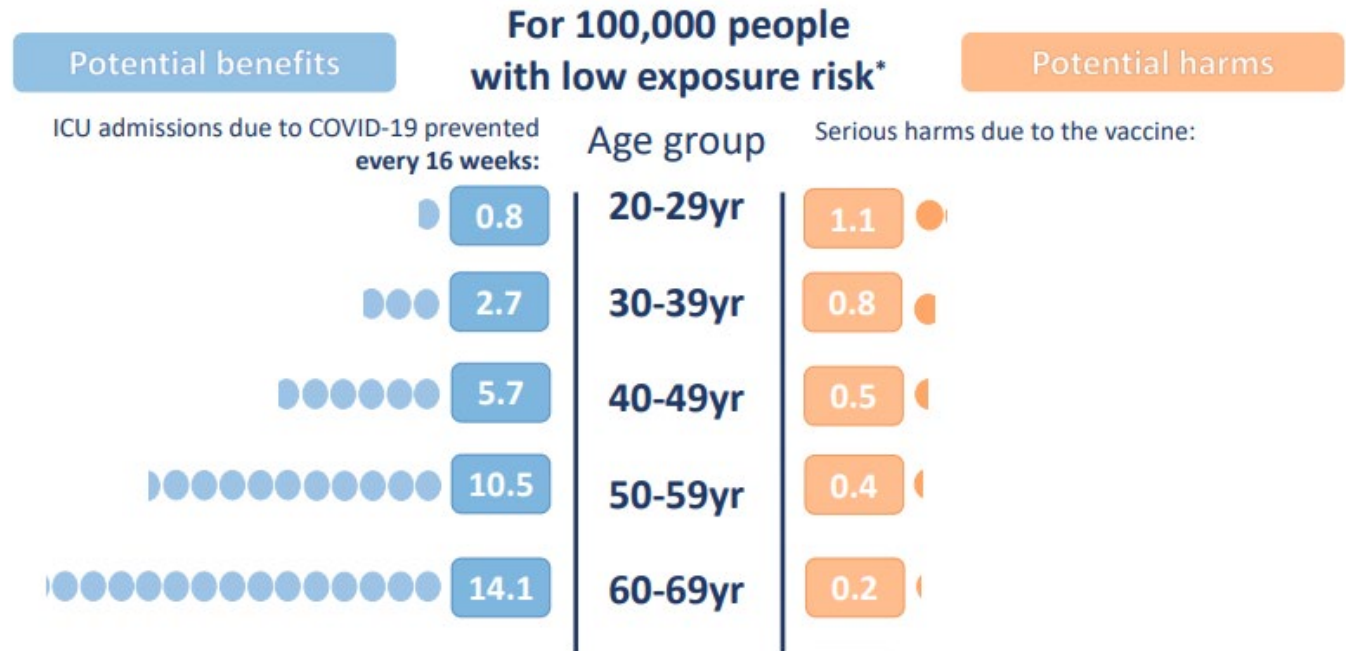
- Expanded eligibility this week to all people aged 40+
- Based on federal guidance
- Benefits of vaccine greatly outweigh rare adverse events
- Response positive to date, some appointments do remain available

# Urban Indigenous Clinics



## Improving Access Across Manitoba

- 5 clinics to launch in the coming weeks, in Winnipeg, Portage, Brandon and Thompson
- Culturally safe space, addresses barriers people may face
- Most appointments made with call centre, others can be walk-in
- Follow provincial eligibility criteria
- Will also help support immunizations of people who are homeless (aged 18+), along with focused immunization teams

# First Responders

## Expanded to Include Front-lines

- Eligibility expands today to include front-line police officers, firefighters
- Can make appointments by phone & online today as of 11:45
- About 2,400 front-line police officers
- About 4,700 firefighters, including full-time members and paid on-call members
- Based on NACI Stage 2



# Community- based Prioritization



## Expanding to Include Higher-risk Areas

- Eligibility will expand to include all people aged 18+ living in higher-risk geographies
- Based on an analysis of COVID-19 case rates, population density and percentages of racialized populations, lower-income people and suitable housing in those areas
- Decisions on first eligible communities underway
- Details & first appointments available to be booked on Friday



# Community-based Prioritization



## Expanded to Include Public-facing Roles

- Community-based prioritization will include people who work in those communities in specific roles.
- Initial phase of eligibility will include people who work in priority communities:
  - at a school,
  - as a child care or day care provider,
  - in a food processing facility, including as a food inspector,
  - as a public health inspector or workplace safety and health officer,
  - at a grocery store, convenience store or retail gas location, or
  - anywhere that serves or provides food, including restaurants, food banks, soup kitchens.
- Initial appointments to open on Friday, with the eligible communities
- Based on NACI Stage 2
