

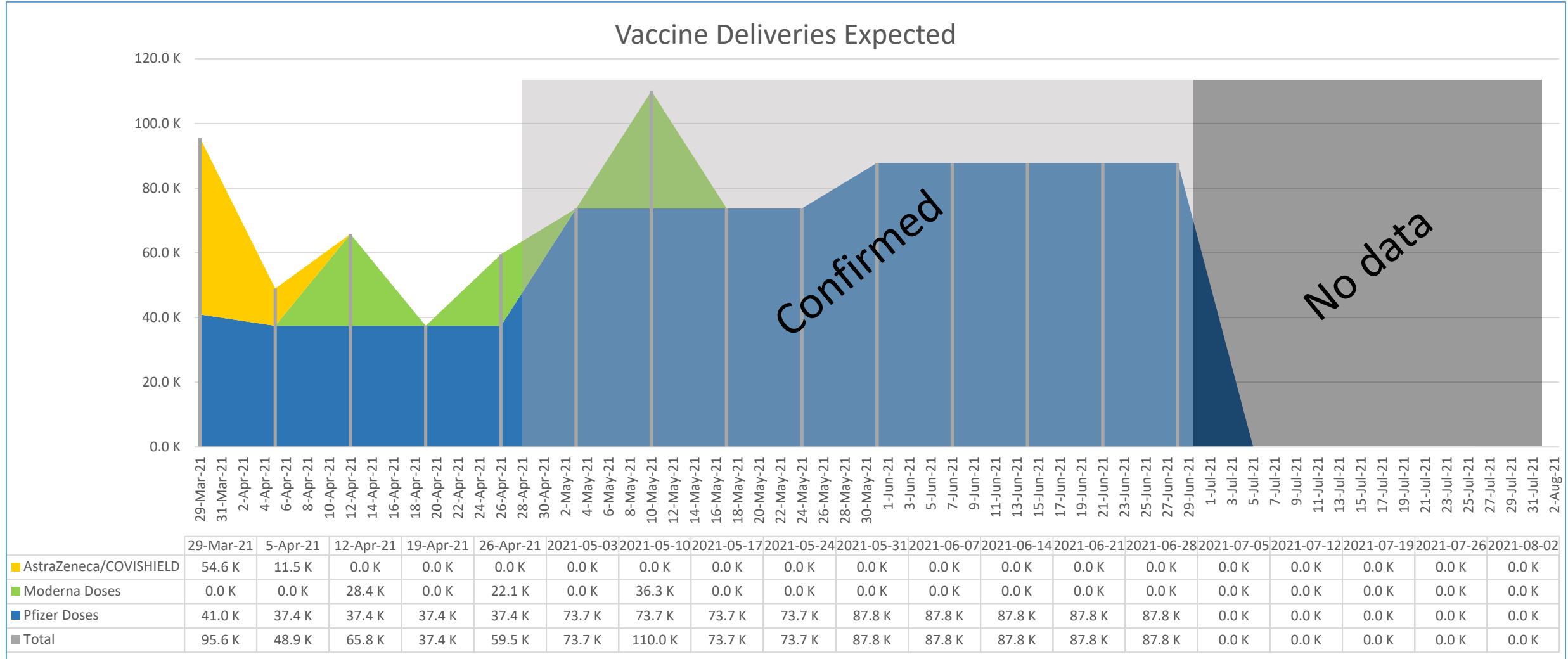

COVID-19 DOSE DELIVERY SCHEDULE

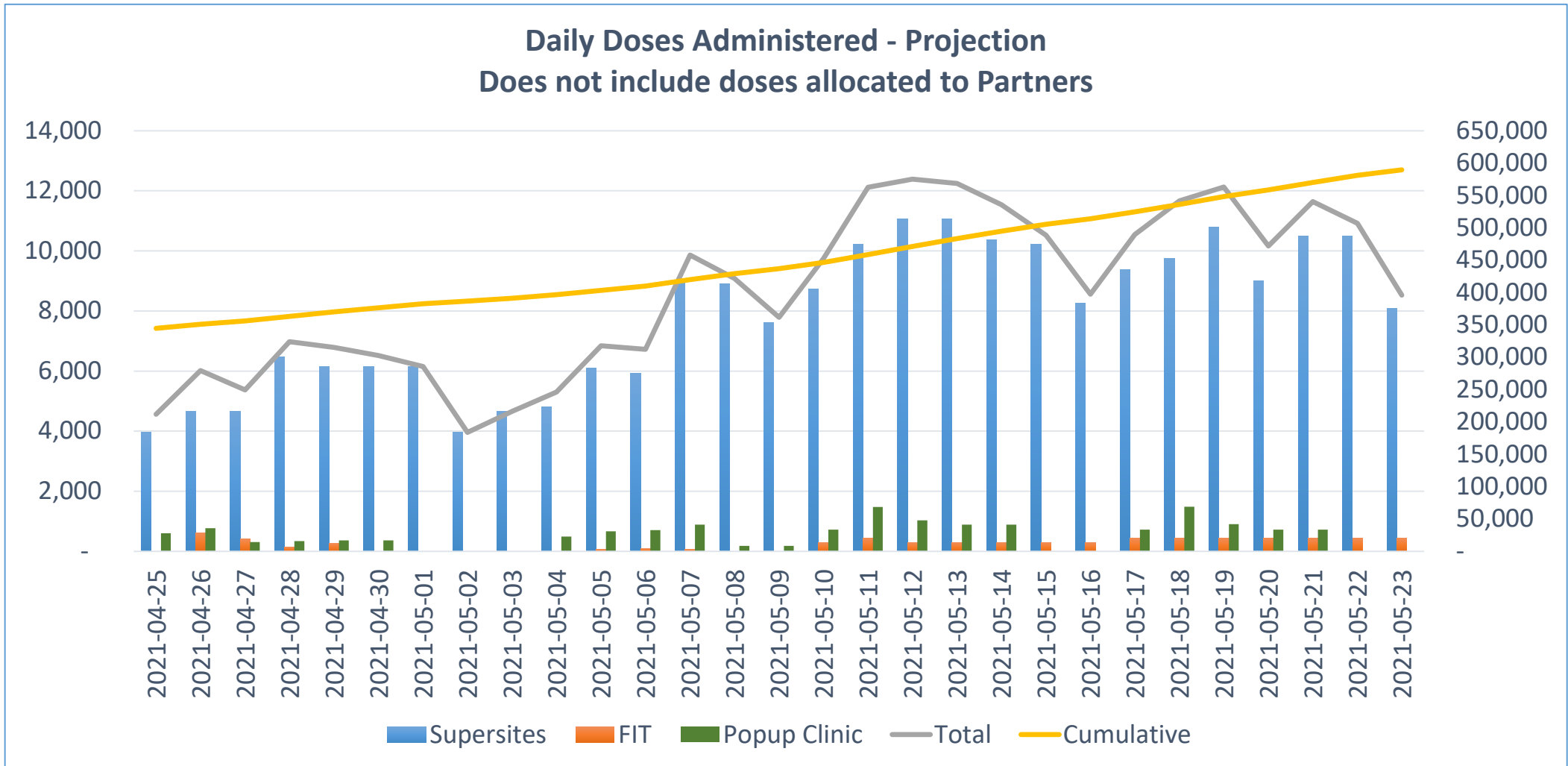


As of April 27, 2021.

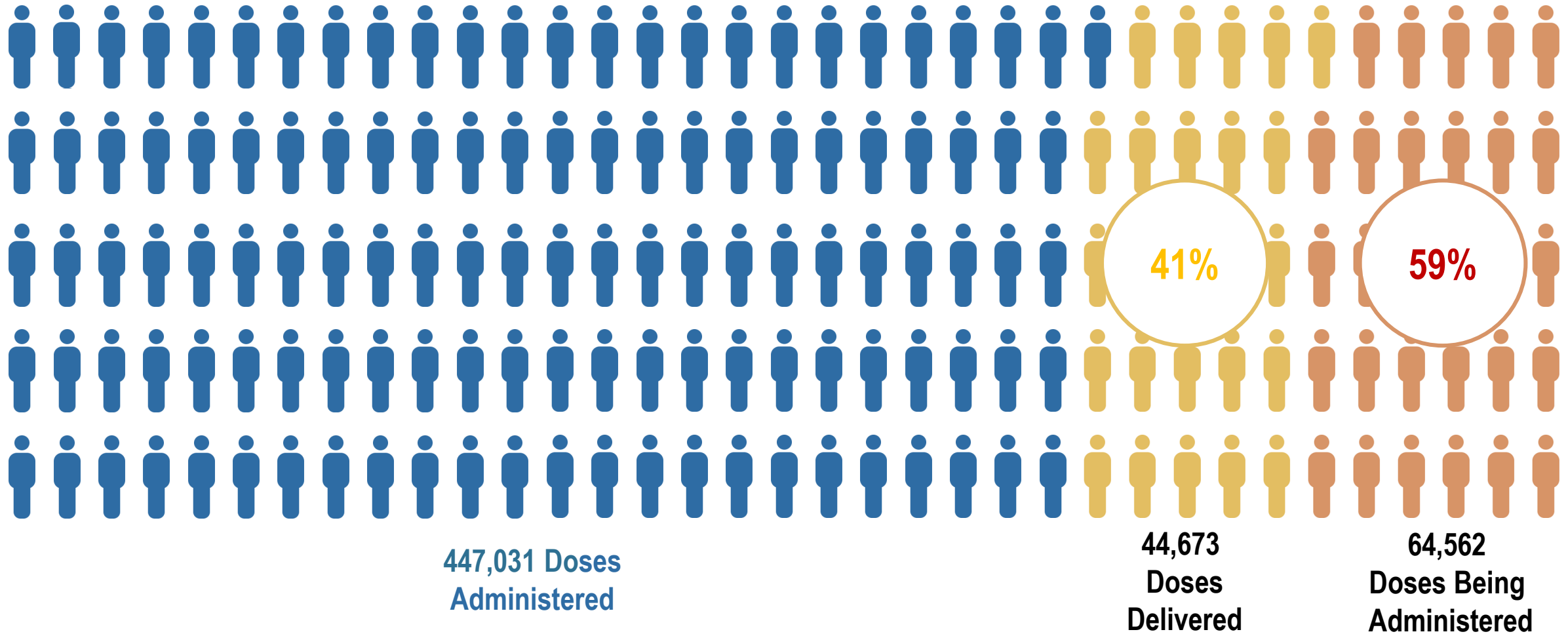
Moderna shipment for the week of Apr 19 is delayed. Expected arrive in the following week, reduced to 22,100 doses.

Pfizer shipments increase to 73,710 doses each week from the week of May 3, and further ramp up to 87,750 doses each week from the week of May 31 to June 28

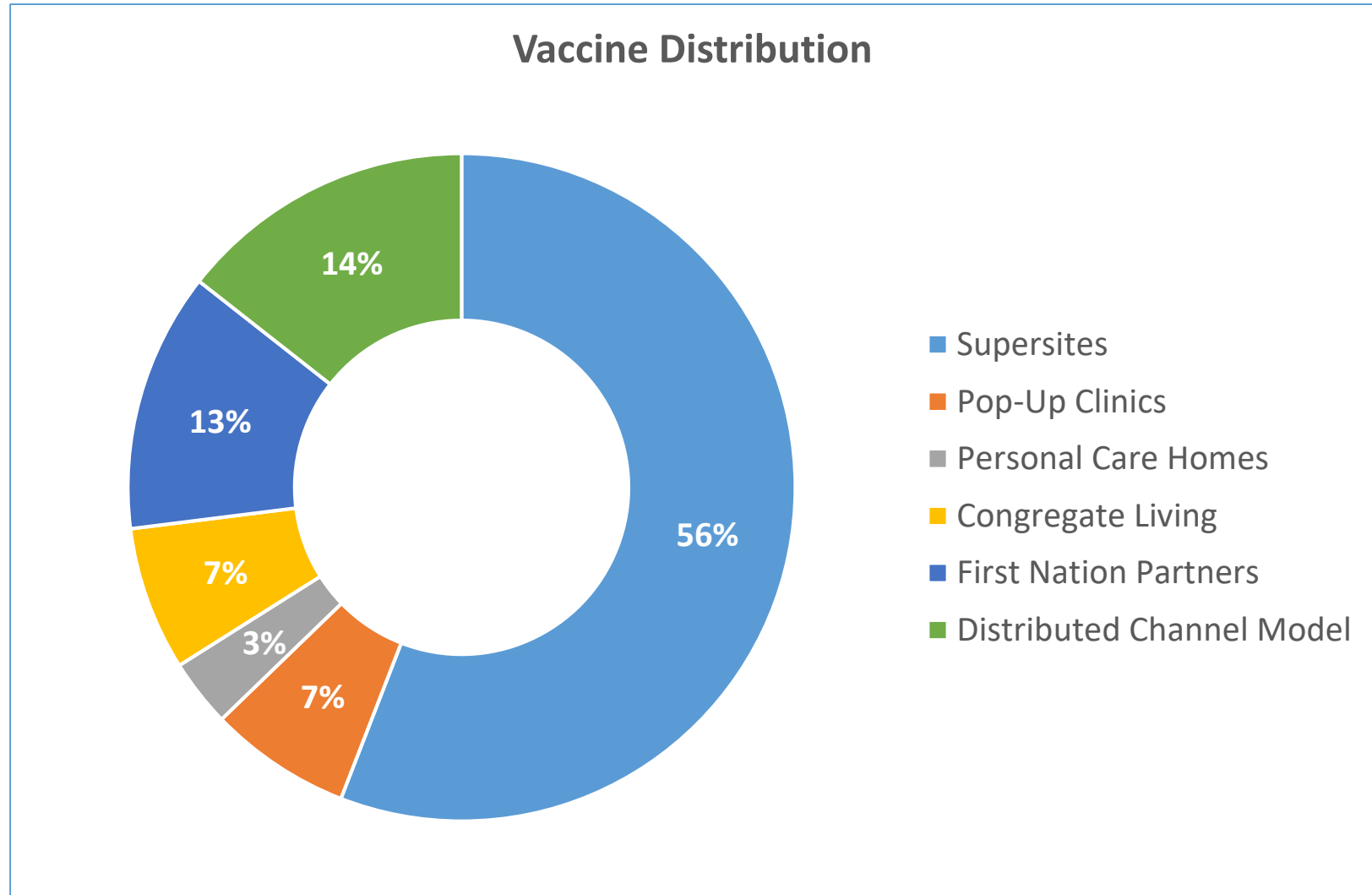

IMMUNIZATION FORECAST SCENARIO

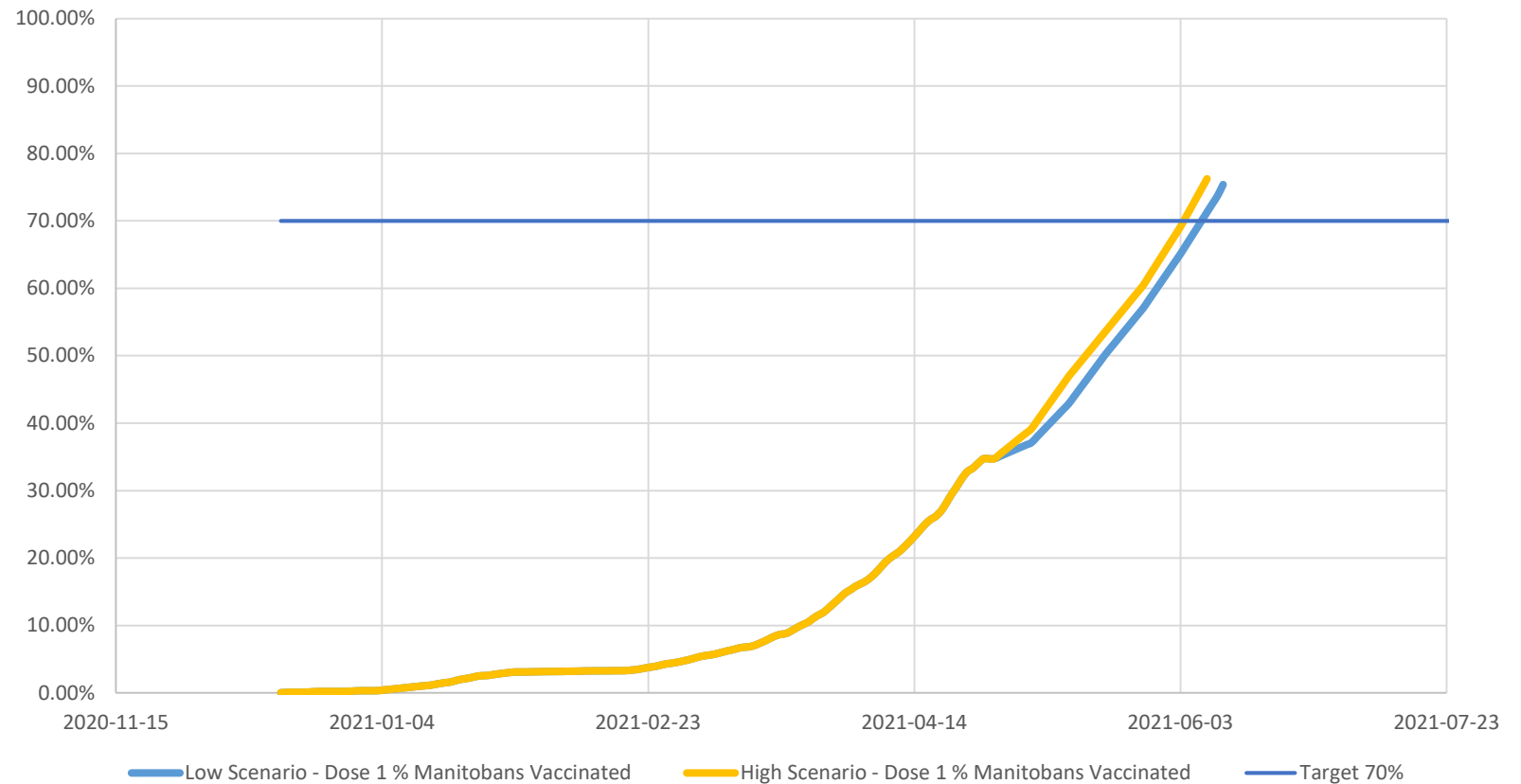


Low Supply Scenario: Based on Pfizer, Moderna and AstraZeneca/Covishield vaccines.

High Supply Scenario: Based on Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca/Covishield, and Janssen.

Target: 70% uptake rate (18+)
Low supply scenario: **June 9**
High supply scenario: **June 5**

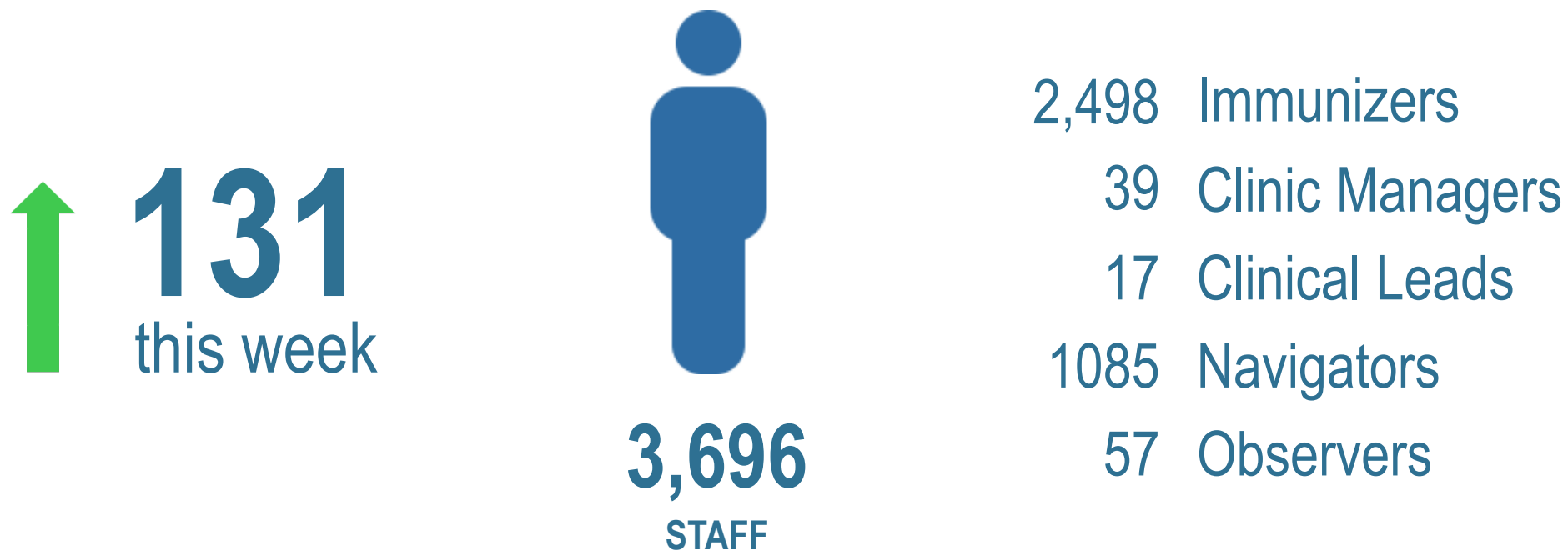

COMMUNITY- BASED ELIGIBILITY

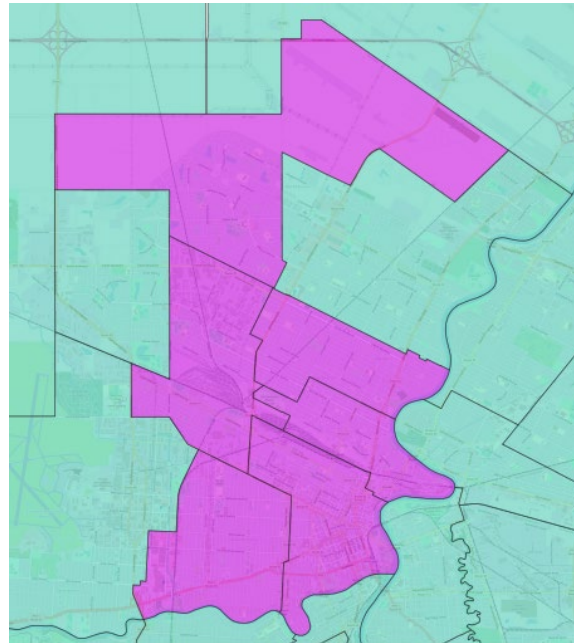


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Expanding to Include More Communities

- Eligibility includes all people aged 18+ living in higher-risk geographies as well as people working in specified jobs
- Communities eligible to book today:
 - Point Douglas North
 - Downtown West
 - Brandon Downtown
 - Pacific Ave. to the north
 - 1st St. to the east
 - Richmond Ave. to the south
 - Between 17th and 18th St. to the west

COMMUNITY- BASED ELIGIBILITY



Expanding to Include Higher-risk Areas

- Communities that continue to be eligible:
 - Inkster East,
 - Downtown East,
 - Point Douglas South, and
 - Seven Oaks West.
- Specified jobs in these 7 communities:
 - at a K-12 school,
 - as a child care or day care provider,
 - in a food processing facility, including as a food inspector,
 - as a public health inspector or workplace safety and health officer
 - grocery store, convenience store or retail gas location, or
 - anywhere that serves or provides food, including restaurants, food banks, soup kitchens.
- 18+ eligibility also includes all people living and working (in any job) in the Northern Regional Health Authority, including Churchill.

VACCINE UPTAKE AND HESITANCY



What We Know

- Manitoba has a table with data science, public health, communications and engagement and VITF officials to evaluate current situation, identify data needs, recommend policy and communications
- Current rates of vaccination show broad coverage at the overall population level
- Highest rates of vaccination are seen in those age cohorts that have been eligible the longest
- However - we are beginning to see patterns emerge, identifying communities, populations & demographics that are falling behind

Next Steps

- Outreach for feedback from public health and community partners
- Targeted #ProtectMB advertising or community-led initiatives
- Ongoing work with ethno-cultural and newcomer-serving organizations
- Government policy or service responses – such as community-based eligibility
- Translation and language materials
- Continuous process to advance vaccination results
- Outreach with religious and civic leaders in key regions
