Campground Tips

- Be Wildlife Smart. Do not feed any wildlife, including birds or squirrels. You are in black bear country - secure all attractants such as food, cooking equipment and trash in a locked vehicle. Do not store food or attractants in your tent.
- Practice Leave No Trace. Pack out all gear and trash to keep the campsites clean for others.
- Keep dogs on leash and clean up after your pet.
- Learn to recognize and avoid poisonous plants such as poison ivy.
- Open fires are prohibited. Use portable stoves or fire pits provided.
- Don't Move Firewood - Moving firewood can spread harmful invasive species and destroy our forests.
- Prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. Always clean, drain, dry watercraft and water related equipment. Visit manitoba.ca/stopais for full regulations.
- In case of injury or illness contact a Park Attendant or Park Patrol Officer. They can assist you to reach medical help.

Nutimik Lake Campground

- Nutimik the Cree word for "up the river"



Come to the place that means "up the river" in Cree: Nutimik Lake Campground in Whiteshell Provincial Park. Facilities near the campground at Nutimik Lake Lodge include a grocery store and a gas station. Picnic areas and a playground are located near Whiteshell River. Nutimik Lake is beside the campground, with the Whiteshell River to the north.

Enjoy a day outdoors playing volleyball on one of the campgrounds courts or launch a boat for a relaxing time on the water. Learn about nature and culture at the interpretive programs. Hike the 2.5 kilometres to Pine Point Rapids

Hiking Trail between Nutimik and Betula Lakes on Provincial Highway #307.

Be sure to visit the Whiteshell Natural History Museum at Nutimik. This authentic log building has an excellent collection of bird and animal specimens from the boreal forest.

Nutimik Lake Campground is located east of Provincial Road #307.
